

Getting Started with Google Maps: Adding KML data

Welcome to the Essential ArcGIS Task Sheet Series. This series supplements the Iowa State University GIS Geospatial Technology Training Program short course series, "Essential ArcGIS Tutorial Series." The task sheets are designed to provide quick, easy instructions for performing specific tasks in GIS.

A KML file is a Google Earth format which is supported by servered mapping applications including Google Maps, a free online resource from Google which allows for personalized maps and sharing of spatial data. To get started, visit https://www.google.com/accounts/NewAccount for a new account or visit www.maps.google.com if an account has already been made.

1. Log into My Google Maps

Open a web browser and go to **www.maps.google.com**.

2. Adding KML Data

2. Click the Import link.

Click My Maps > Create New Map.

- 1. In the new window, name the map and give it a description.
 - Under **Title**, give the map a name.
 - Under **Description**, give the map narration.

- In the Import KML window, select Browse.
- Browse to a desired KML file.
- Select Upload from File.



4. The features will be displayed on the map automatically. By clicking on the points, you can open an editor window, allowing for Title and Description of each feature to be added
